Trove is the online search tool of the National Library of Australia where you can find more than [361,363,217](#) Australian resources such as books, images, historical newspapers, maps, music and archives. Should you come across any spelling errors you are able to correct them online, either as a visitor or as a registered user, thereby making the information more accurate. The *Kalgoorlie Western Argus* (1896-1916), its successor the *Western Argus* (1916-1938) and the *Kalgoorlie Miner* (1895-) have been digitised on Trove. They are mines of information about local and family history. Each edition is fully searchable using optical recognition by name or subject and the results can be printed or saved to your computer.
